#### Ash Fork Water Service News

Ash Fork well #3- currently pumping- Project nears completion

The new well project is 98% completed with the well (AF #3) currently pumping to waste to allow for it to clean out sediment. The fence around the new well is nearing completion and only a small amount of work at the well head is left to call the project complete. The installation of a Transducer down the well will help us monitor pumping levels and recovery times.

We will be pumping the well on and off to waste over the next 30 to 60 days to get it to clean up sufficiently to run into the system. It may be that we do not require the extra production that the new well gives us, until the higher demand months of late Spring and Summer.

Current production rates for our Groundwater wells

AF #1 (Our Back-up well) 95-GPM AF #2 (Our Primary production well) 124-GPM

AF #3 (Our newest well) 44-GPM est.

When water demand increases, the plan will be to run AF #2 & #3 simultaneously, thus our primary production rate will be 168 GPM. A very nice position.

Ash Fork Water Service just completed its onsite inspection from ADEQ. This inspection is completed every 3-years. We updated our emergency operations plan, re-filed our Lead and Copper report for 2024 and passed all the other review except, the inspector felt we had too much soil and rock outside the foundation ring on our 2 water-storage tanks and that ½ of the ring should be exposed.

. The rings have been in that condition since I came to work here over 30 years ago. The current situation provides for positive drainage away from the tanks.

All annual Backflow testing was completed in October this year.

Winter is around the corner. Winterize your water system now. Plug in your heat tapes. Cover your outside hose bibs. **Plan ahead!**

We have been busy this last month with the purchase of 32 acres north of town for the Sanitary waste station and potential AFDA community projects. This is a joint project between AFDA and the Sanitary District. It was Fayrene's hope that someday we would be able to build a ball field for Little League to use. ## Are you concerned about your failing septic system or cesspool?

Yavapai County is offering grant funding to help homeowners replace failing septic systems or cesspools through the Yavapai County Home Repair Program. This program provides eligible homeowners with a new, legally permissible septic system at no cost.

## About the Funding

Yavapai County received funding from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program to assist low- and moderate- income homeowners in replacing failing septic systems and cesspools to ensure they are safe for people, animals, and the environment.

## How to Apply

Yavapai County is receiving applications starting soon. You may join the waitlist now by contacting the Yavapai County Environmental Unit by phone: (928)771-3214, or email: Enviro.Services@yavapaiaz.gov. Funding is limited, so we encourage you to join the waitlist as soon as possible.

We may ask you the following questions to help determine your eligibility:

- Are you a resident of Yavapai County and a legal resident of the U.S.?
- Have you occupied the home full-time, year-round, for at least 12 months?
- . Do you certify that you plan to occupy the property as your principal and only residence for at least five years?
- Are all your property taxes paid up to date?
- Is the home currently insured/insurable?
- Do you, as homeowner, have Fee Simple title to the property?

If you are unsure about your answers to any of the questions above, please reach out to Yavapai County Environmental Unit to help clarify. If you do not qualify, Yavapai County will not investigate or cite you for the current conditions of your wastewater system.



Interested in trying a session? Bring a mat or towel and come as you are!


# Sewing Classes—First Friday and Third Friday of Every Month

## Yavapai Health Clinic

The clinic has been slowly growing in serving our community. If you haven't stopped in to visit or make an appointment, they are very friendly and ready to assist any way they can. They are currently open every Friday from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Until the paperwork catches up with our clinic, the doctors are utilizing tele-health to meet with patients, but hopes are that by the first of the year, doctors will be on site and may expand to 2 or 3 days a week as demand grows.

Work is in progress to add a pharmacy where your prescriptions can be filled here in town instead of having to travel 20 to 25 miles to the nearest pharmacy.

Every Friday they have some items of fresh vegetables or other food to give away to anyone who would like to take some.



## It's shoebox season again!

Operation Christmas Child, a project of Samaritan's Purse, is collecting shoebox gifts—filled with school supplies, hygiene items, and fun toys—to be delivered to children in need around the world in order to demonstrate God's love for them in a tangible way. For many of these children, these carefully packed shoeboxes are the first gifts they have ever received, and can be a treasure that lets them know they are not alone and not forgotten.

Since 1993, more than 232 million children in over 170 countries and territories have received a shoebox gift... and hundreds of those boxes have come through the generosity of donors right here in Ash Fork.

This year, 12 million more children will receive shoebox gifts, and you can be a part of that! Things like tooth-brushes, school supplies, hygiene items, and small toys may seem commonplace to us, but to children affected by war, poverty, famine, and disease, they can life-changing.

Some suggested items to pack would be: "Wow" items (stuffed animals, dolls, clothing), personal care items (combs, toothbrushes, washcloths), school supplies (pencils, pens, notebooks, scissors, erasers, sharpeners), toys (balls, yo-yos, hacky sacks, Etch A Sketch).

Some items that *cannot* be included are: candy, gum, toothpaste, soap, used or damaged items, war-related items, or anything liquid or breakable.
