Ash Fork Water Service News

2025 was one of those memorable years! Let's look at the system's many improvements.

- Ash Fork #3 Groundwater Well project is completed. New well drilled to 1445', connecting lines and electrical upgrades. Project was funded through the American Rescue Plan Act. Total project cost was approx. \$965,000.

- Arsenic Treatment Plant was installed at Ash Fork #1 ground water well site. ADEQ picked up the cost of this Treatment Plant installation. Ash Fork Water Service had to participate in the permitting costs. The installation went well. The Arsenic Treatment Plant was installed within the newly completed pump house.

- Ash Fork Water Service along with the Ash Fork Development Association group will be making plans to host an OPEN HOUSE in early Spring 2026. The Open House will allow customers and all those interested to see the well sites along with the treatment facilities within the pump house structures. We're looking forward to it. I hope to see you there.

- Work was completed on the modifications to the Park St. standpipe building. An order was placed for a new Water Salesman. The new unit will be the same as the south side. Bills and coins accepted. Everyone has been waiting on this upgrade.

- We're working on a more detailed Water Curtailment Plan. What we learned from the summer water emergency will be incorporated into the revised Curtailment Plan.

- One of the new projects on the list this year is the evaluation of our system's water storage capabilities. With the increase in water sales seen over the past year, it could be time to plan to add additional water storage facilities.

Where is the best location for a new storage facility?

What amount of water would the new tank hold?

These are some of the questions the report would answer.

- We have a funding application pending with WIFA for system improvements. The funding application was approved by the AZ Corporation Commission. The proposed improvements include:

- Backup Generator to run well pumps in an electrical emergency.

- Exterior coatings on both water storage tanks.

- New Standpipe system.

- 3 water-main installation projects. Bixler Trail south about 1200', Hillside RV, East to Bixler Trail. Replace about 1500', replace line in alleyway between 3rd St to 6th st., between Park Ave. and Pine St. (the oldest line in the system).

The first month's report on the on-line payment option (Pay Star) is all good. Many customers have utilized this option right off.

WOW didn't the community look great for the Christmas Holiday Celebration! The parade!! Awesome.

A big THANK YOU to the AFDA Board for supporting the event and a second THANK YOU to the Atkinson Family and decorators, for ensuring everything was festive and bright!!
