## Ash Fork Water Service News

Well, the newsletter catches the community right in the middle with dealing with a water situation. The grand plan is to manage this water situation as a situation, not as an emergency. We'll wait to see how it comes out.

The well has been pulled. The motor was shorted out. Drill Tech officials have a new pump and motor headed this way. It is planned to be on-site Wednesday morning to start the install. With a start on Wednesday, that should put us in line to start up on Friday.

It's still early to conclude anything, but with the low demand I'm seeing on the standpipe opening here at the water office on Monday at noon, nobody is out of water, and that's a good thing.

The project to connect our new well AF #3 to the system is well underway. The water pipe and electrical conduit have been installed. We still need the pump and motor to be installed and the electrical modification within the pump house. We think 60 days remain to complete the project.

When the new well is tied into the system we will have an additional 40+ gallons-per-minute capacity. This is equivalent to 1.7 million gallons per month. The 2 wells will have the capability to be isolated from each other. This would allow for one well to be under service while the other well would remain in service.

Our Standard Operating Procedure when this project is completed will be to run both wells simultaneously, isolating one or the other on occasions or as needed. We anticipate 190 GPM when the project is completed and both wells are running together.

This water pump situation has differed in one way this time over any other time, as the well in Juniperwood was available to provide water over the weekend. That was invaluable.

Thanks for keeping it going, Russ.

Water conservation is still the action of the week. Conserve where you can.

Other water situations in Northern AZ this Summer:

Bearizona standpipe went down for approx. 2 weeks this summer

Hwy 64 KOA — down 2-weeks paving the water station

Bellemont Truck Stop — Someone ran over the standpipe

Ash Fork Water Service provided an unknown amount of water during these situations. The Bearizona event was the largest.

Note: Beware of the to urge to stockpile water during these times. Stockpiling water is not a conservation act.





# It's shoebox season again!

Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, is once again collecting shoeboxes filled with gifts to be delivered to children in need around the world. The project delivers not only the joy of what, for many kids, may be their first gift ever, but also demonstrates God's love in a tangible way, letting children know they are not alone and not forgotten.

The simple gift of a shoebox filled with small items—things like a toothbrush, hair clips, toy cars, a stuffed animal, or school supplies—can be a life-changing treasure for children in areas affected by war, poverty, disaster, famine, and disease.

Since the project's beginning in 1993, more than 232 million children in over 170 countries and territories around the world have received a shoebox gift—and hundreds of those have come through the generosity of donors right here in Ash Fork.

Some suggested items to pack would be "Wow" items (stuffed animals, dolls, clothing, soccer balls with pumps), personal care items (combs, toothbrushes, washcloths), school supplies (pencils, pens, notebooks, scissors, erasers, sharpeners), and small toys (balls, yo-yos, jump ropes, puzzles). And feel free to add a personal note, just to let that child know they're special and loved.

Some items that *cannot* be included would be: soap, candy, gum, toothpaste, used or damaged items, scary or warrelated items, or anything liquid or breakable.

# Superintendent's Corner


Seth Staples, Superintendent Ash Fork Schools

The school year is well underway! By the time you read this article, Ash Fork Schools will be halfway through the first quarter. There are plenty of new and exciting things happening at the school this year.

One of the most noticeable changes we have started this year is a new "Drop Off and Pick Up" for our parents. We have recognized issues with having all buses, handicap, and parent pick up/drop off in one area. This year we have utilized Maple Street as our designated location for parents to drop off or pick up their child. After several weeks the process has proven to be safe, effective, and quick. All students are picked up and with their guardians in less than ten minutes from the time the bell has rung. A big thanks to all of our parents! You have been amazing through this whole process. We are currently under a temporary right-of—way permit, and are hoping to finalize the process when the permit expires in October.

The Bus Barn is scheduled to be completed mid-September. We are currently just standing by for APS to hook up all our power, followed by a final inspection. The Bus Barn has been a multi-year project that we are anxious to finally see completed. The student/visitor parking that was included in the project has been a much-needed upgrade, with appropriate lighting and sidewalks for our guests and students.

The Ash Fork Schools Governing Board approved a new lighting project that will illuminate our newly-resurfaced soccer field. The addition of field lights will allow more flexible and cooler game and practice times, as well as



allowing us to use the area for more community events. District administration is hoping to resurface and light both softball and baseball fields in the future as finances allow.

In the classroom, we have adjusted our curriculum to reflect needs that were identified after our yearly student, staff and parent survey results. Teachers in all grades are beginning to integrate real-world lessons that help students develop skills that will prepare them for life. The goal is to use current state standards to teach and give practice in areas such as communication, organization, problem solving, and other skills that are used proportionally more than basic academics. It's all a work in progress, and only time will show how effective we can be at preparing our students for both the opportunities and challenges that they will face in the future.
