Ash Fork Water Service has been working to identify all the Service Line Material types in use in the water system. The Service Line is identified as the water piping from the water main to the meter.

This effort is to comply with the revisions to the Safe Drinking Water Act (1991) to further protect children and communities from lead exposure in our nation's drinking water systems.

An extensive effort has been made to identify all material types in use within the system. Meter change out reports, visual inspection of the lines and historical documents were used in the identification.

After our inventory process was complete, we still had 2 service lines that had not been identified. These 2 connections were mailed notices stating their service line material type was undetermined at this time.

Service lines were classified as Lead, Galvanized lines downstream of a lead service line, Non-Lead, or Unknown.

AT THIS TIME ASH FORK WATER SERVICE HAS <u>NOT</u> IDENTIFIED ANY LEAD SERVICE LINES IN USE WITHIN OUR SYSTEM.

Within the new pump house plans are currently being crafted to get an Arsenic treatment plant installed. ADEQ agreed to fund the project. We are getting a similar plant to the one located at Ash Fork #2. I look for that plant to be in service in 2025.

The contract has been signed and a good time to start is all that's holding back the work to connect our new well (Ash Fork #3) to the system. Approximately 950' of electrical line and water piping are needed to be installed. Grading and fencing at the well head. Modifying the existing pump house electrical and adding new well controls are all part of the project. I am looking for the project to start early in Spring and be complete sometime in 2025.

If you remember back in 2022, Ash Fork Water Service applied for financing approval from the Arizona Corporation Commission. Ash Fork Water Service intended to apply to WIFA (Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of AZ) for funding. This process is concluding.

Some preliminary numbers show Ash Fork Water Service has been authorized for funding in the amount of \$1,057,000. With that funding we intend to:

With the WIFA funding program, I anticipate a large percentage of the funds falling into the "Forgivable Principal" Category. A very favorable funding scenario!

ASH FORK COMMUNITY EARTH DAY

As we live in a rural community, and many outside of town, we have different approaches and concerns to daily living than most Americans. We haul water, maintain septic tanks, install solar panels, harvest gardens, and trim trees. These are the most prevalent of our challenges of countryside living. We all have had a learning curve on successfully adapting to off-grid rural living, yet there are always questions and more to learn.

Earth Day has caught on nationwide as a day to show how we can move closer to daily green living with plantings, products, and learning more of the life cycles of Earth.

Introducing: The Ash Fork Community Earth Day, which is tailored to meet the needs of those who specifically live here. A one-day event on Saturday, April 26, 2025, will take place near the Ash Fork Museum/parking lot (next to the new Post Office) from 10:30 to 2:30pm.

Speakers are being scheduled at half-hour intervals to include these topics: tree biology, preservation, and care; composting tips and growing plants with improved natural soil; responsible septic use and maintenance; alternatives to plastics and recycling; solar usage as a household power source. There will also be a presentation on the pending waste water treatment plant that is proposed for the Ash Fork community.

The best part of these presentations is that each topic will have time scheduled for questions and answers and a public forum. The public forum allows anyone who has had successful experiences to share their information with attendees after each presentation. Any and all information is welcome as there may be another person having a problem that your advice solves.

Also, a posting is coming soon on AFDA and Ash Fork Community Facebook pages for local vendors to apply to set up a table with their wares. These spaces are for local vendors who have "green" products, such as their own produce, eggs, meat, or prepared foods from their own fruit trees and gardens. Other "green" products for vendors to sell include products that are biodegradable and nonpolluting to the environment. This is also an opportunity for those who sell their products year round to promote their business. The first 20 applicants that have wares to sell in this category will be accepted with payment.

SO COME ONE, COME ALL! It is an opportunity to share what you've learned and have some of the questions you've had answered or try new approaches to solving problems. Save the date, bring your own water and notebook for information you may want to jot down. Come to experience a few hours that will enhance our daily living that preserves our land and water.




